- Respect the rights, dignity & worth of every person, regardless of their ability, gender, cultural background or religion
- Never use derogatory language based on race or gender
- Take instruction from any Club official during training, games, or Club events
- Refrain from doing anything which might cause damage to the reputation of the Flagstaff Hill Football Club
- Do not enter a change room at any time without an invitation from the Coach or Team Manager
- Respect the Club's facilities & equipment
- Recognise & support the voluntary contributions of all Club officials
- Support Flagstaff Hill Football Club officials in maintaining the highest standard of behaviour both on and off the field for the betterment of the Club & the community

Any breach of the above conduct agreement will be addressed by a Flagstaff Hill Football Club official. Persistent concerns or breaches may result in suspension or disciplinary action.
