We started the season against last year's Premiers & after losing Sauce Jacobs after the 1st ruck tap the boys battled hard & fought their way to a solid 1st up win. This set the tone for the year as we had key players missing at different times however the depth of our Senior Playing Group was evident as we enjoyed an undefeated Season & set the standard for the SFL. We were pushed by the Opposition at times & this included the 2nd Semi Final vs Noarlunga which was squared away with approx. 5 mins to go, the boys dug deep & kicked the last 2 goals to proceed to the GF.

The Grand Final was played in almost perfect conditions & the boys ran out in the GF traditional away white jumper. Wary of what Noarlunga had shown in the 2nd Semi the boys were up for it & welcomed back Sammy T for his 1st A Grade game of the year. It was evident from our 2nd goal of the game that the boys were not looking to repeat the 2nd Semi Final performance & every quarter the margin increased & we ran out comfortable winners by 59 pts to secure our 7th A Grade Flag in the past 8 Seasons. Congratulations to the Coaching Group, Matt B the Team Manager & everyone who was involved with A Grade.

I would like to congratulate all Players that pulled on an A Grade jumper in 2023, unfortunately players missed out on GF selection however don't be disheartened by that, 2024 presents new opportunities as we aim to go back-to-back. Finally, congratulation to Brad Kirk on a solid season & winning the Club B & F again.

B Grade

After a busy off Season with Club recruitment Graham Tomkins (GT) was keen to improve on Season 2022 & this saw a couple of players return to the Club due to his influence. Once again it was a challenging year for GT, Cav & Stoney as they constantly juggled what players were available as they were in & out of A/B Grade on a regular basis plus players pushing for selection from C Grade.

The season started off with a narrow 7-point loss to Reynella however this was the only negative for the year as they then proceed to win the next 15 games straight with an average winning margin of 76 Pts & 6 wins in excess of 100 pts! This showed the depth of our Senior squad as players were in & out of A & C Grade with Team selections never easy on a Thursday night. After a solid minor round the boys entered the finals full of confidence & took on a strong Reynella side in the 2nd Semi, despite appalling accuracy in front of goals they got home comfortably by 27 pts to reach the GF.

The GF produced a surprise opponent in Happy Valley who had finished 4th needing to win their final Minor round game to ensure finals qualification. It was a close 1st half then our boys settled & kicked away in the 2nd half to win by 49 pts & get GT his 1st Senior Premiership as a Coach. I have been extremely fortunate to be involved with an amazing Group of Coaches, Team Managers, Leaders, Trainers, Volunteers and the Old Farts plus the support of the Executive Committee as we set out to achieve our goals in 2023. The 1 thing I will take away from this Season is an important point from A Grade Coach Zane who stressed this every week & that's **"have fun"**. We did have fun & we had success, can't ask for much more.



AUSKICK REPORT



2023 saw a change in day, time and co-ordinator for our Auskick program. Before reflecting on the year, it is important that we acknowledge and thank Leith Mitchell for all of the work he did in the role as our co-ordinator over the past few years, and thank the Williams family for the support they provided; their efforts laid strong foundations for our program and its success in 2023. Thank You Leith, Neil, Jacko and Lanie.

We made the decision to move from a Sunday morning to a Friday evening, after trialling it for two weeks in 2022, and the only way to describe the result is as a resounding success.

Our first term, Term 2, saw 58 kids register and participate for the 8 week program. Whilst we knew what numbers to expect on our first night, we did not fully comprehend what trying to keep that many kids engaged for an hour would take. With the initial teething out of the way, we got into a groove and ran a well organised program each week. Focusing on the basic skills of football; holding the ears, pointing the nose and kicking the chin of the ball when kicking, scooping the ice-cream when handballing, big bear hugs with our elbows tucked in for chest marks, big W's for our overhead marks and kicking sausage rolls, with the biggest focus being our number 1 rule each week....having FUN.

Given the success of running two terms in 2022, we repeated this in 2023 and could not imagine what this would bring. An amazing 80 kids registered for Term 3, 26 of them returning for a second round after being with us in Term 2.Unbeknownst to us, the SANFL ran a footy clinic at Craigburn Primary School at the start of Term 3 and promoted our program, which saw a huge influx in registrations. Other factors included being the only clinic in the West Adelade zone, outside of the clinic at Westies, that ran in Term 3, and positive word of mouth during Term 2 also saw families leave clinics close by and choose to stay with us into Term 3 (i.e. we did not count their registrations in Term 2).

Our focus was again the same in Term 3, living the club values of junior development and having fun, and as the subbies season came to an end, we were provided with the opportunity to use more oval space and introduce the kids to play mini games of football each week as part of the rotation of stations. This was a hit with the kids and given the age demographic, should have many ready to move into Subbies next year. On that, we will be sure to reach out to all of the families with kids eligible for subbies in 2024 and provide them with all of the necessary information and invite them to continue their footy journey on the next step in the Falcon pathway.

Managing this many kids, aged between 5 and 12, is not easy, let alone keeping them engaged for 60 minutes, and could not have been done without the help of many. In Term 2, special thanks needs to go to David Kearsley, Stu Whitelaw and Adam Carey, all of whom had kids participating in the program but were willing to forego spending time with their own kids to man stations each week and provide their knowledge and enthusiasm to the masses; Thank You Gents. Kears backed his efforts up again in Term 3, so another thanks to him, and to Connor too for sharing his Dad. Outside of these individuals, it is as important that we call out all of our players who helped over different weeks; we had U/15's, U/17's, senior women and men all attend, often multiple times to allow us to set up multiple stations each week. Multiple stations meant that the kids could get a variety of activities in and not have to wait too long in line to do them. Not only does this assistance from our players give the kids an immediate benefit, but is a great reflection on our club and will no doubt have many families seeing ours as the club they want to be at it the future. Thanks also needs to go to Charlie Kitto from the SANFL who helped with the behind the scenes administration, attending trainings to help on stations and drop off additional equipment when our participant numbers got away from us.

Without the aim of self-promotion, I will admit that I was recognised with an award at the recent SANFL Volunteer Awards Night, being named the Auskick Co-ordinator of the Year for the West Adelaide zone. The reason I call this out, is that as per the above, this was truly a club effort to build the program to what it was and everyone that participated, be it every week or for one week, should be very proud of what was achieved.
