Treasurers Report

As has been the case for some years now, the Club continued to grow in 2024.

Receipts for the year totaled \$316,059.23, and that is the highest amount we have taken.

Gate Takings for the season were \$12,016.45, which was also a record and profits from the Canteen, BBQ, and Coffee totaled just over \$52,000.

Sponsorship continues to be at an impressive level with the Club being supported too the tune of just over \$43,000 in 2024.

A number of new Sponsors have become involved with the Club, and all Sponsors now have signed Partnership Agreements.

The traditional Flagstaff Ball, Ladies Day, and Club 150 all went well, as did many of the traditional fundraising events.

Raffles and Lucky Squares were sold throughout the year resulting in over \$3,000 being raised.

On the Expenditure side, most items came in around expectations.

The amount of work done by our volunteers seemed to reach an even greater level in 2024.

I cannot imagine another club having anywhere near the same level of support that our club receives every week. Well done everyone!

We are well placed for 2025.

Sub-Junior Football Director's Report

The beginning of 2024 saw a change to the sub junior age groups going from U8's, U10's and U12's to a new structure of U7's, U9's and U11's. With this the SFL also made some changes to the team sizes with a view to ensure that all children playing received as much game time as possible.

We had a total of 115 players across the 9 teams which comprised of 2 U7 Teams, 4 U9 Teams, 2 U11 Mixed Teams and 1 U11 Girls Team. I would like to thank all of our support staff for 2024 in particular our coaches (Simon, Matt D, Leigh, Damien, Lee, Doug, Clint, Matt B and Ben) and team managers (Mike, Becky, Amalie, Jodie, Bec, Sam, Jaime and Michelle) for all of their hard work.

By far the biggest challenge that we faced this year was the scheduling of our games. Due to the fact that there was a total of 31 U9 teams in the competition in comparison to the 13 U7 teams it meant that a number of our teams had children spread out across various grounds, leaving support staff stretched very thin. The league also introduced several Friday night games, which although enjoyed by the children, again left families with children in multiple places at once. I would like to take this opportunity to commend the families on they way they handled these challenges without complaint, even lending children to play up where conflicts had diminished team numbers.

As with most years, it could be a challenge to cover the volunteer BBQ and canteen shifts but with each family averaging 4 shifts each throughout the 13 game season, the team managers did a fantastic job in having these jobs covered each week.

We concluded our season with 3 carnival weekends, followed by a successful sub junior presentation day held at the club.

Moving into 2025 we will have 15 of our Under 11 players eligible to move up to the Junior Football Program (4 Female and 11 Male) and based on the success of our Auskick program for 2024, we would hope to see a number of new sub juniors joining the competition.

Remaining on a Friday evening, and following our 4 Simple Rules – Everyone has a footy, Everyone is Safe, Listen to the Coaches and most importantly, HAVE FUN, we saw 101 different children register with us across the two terms, with 75 participants in each of Term 2 and Term 3.

For many years we have prided ourselves on Junior Development and to have over 100 different kids participate in Auskick at our club in 2024 shows that this is still the most important pillar to build our club on and hopefully many of these kids are running around in the red and blue for years to come.

If these numbers weren't impressive enough, we should highlight and celebrate the fact that we had 28 females registered in Term 3. It is here that we need to recognise that Bella, one of our senior women, put her hand up to assist with both terms of Auskick in 2024. Without any ties to the Auskick program, Bella was there for all 16 weeks to ensure the Auskickers were able to be split into small groups and get as much time doing drills as possible. The impact Bella had cannot be underestimated, the future of our club and girls/ladies programs rely on juniors coming through and in the second term alone, Bella made a difference to the 28 girls in Auskick.

And whilst thanking our helpers, we also need to call out the regular contributions of Kears, Karns, Nat, Lenny and India, plus the senior players who chipped in throughout the year. With so many kids in attendance each week, we had to continually refine how we did things and having so many helpers allowed us to run multiple stations each week. So many people on the oval can be overwhelming for the young kids, and being able to place them in the same small groups each week not only ensured as much time touching a footy as possible but also gave them a sense of comfort, security and familiarity. This was no doubt a reason we continued to attract new families throughout each term following the positive word of mouth from the existing parents.

In combination with Auskick, we saw the return of our Tiny Tots program in 2024, and the work Blake Aldridge did here needs to be recognised. For a young man in his early 20's to volunteer his Friday afternoons to work with 2-4 year olds cannot be undersold. Families were screaming out for this program for their kids who were not old enough for Auskick and thanks to Blake, the club was able to run it for a second year and he has no doubt tied these kids to the club for years

to come. It was great to see the next generation of Shearers (two lots), Kearsley's, Ramage's and Lendrum's to name a few running around with Blake on a Friday night.

Highlights for the year included -

- 36 kids getting the opportunity to play on Adelaide Oval at half time of AFL games.
- 12 girls getting the opportunity to play on Alberton Oval at half time of an AFLW game.
- West Adelaide recognising the work of our volunteers through the season, and popularity of
 the program in our area, by running a 6 week Superkick clinic at our club in Term 4. This
 gave our volunteers a break but also gave our kids further opportunity to develop their skills
 ready for next years subbies season.
- The final session and presentation for Term 3. With all other grades finished and Auskick being the only program left on the Friday night, we saw standing room only in the club room that night. It was brilliant to see the Auskickers, their siblings, parents and grandparents packing out the rooms and poor old Billy behind the bar needed a good rest once they had left!

Looking forward, 53 of our Auskickers from 2024 are eligible for Subbies in 2025 and we will work hard to welcome as many of these into competitive football as possible but know for the ones that are not quite ready, we will have another year of Auskick ready to them.

In 2023, this report finished by calling out that our program was recognised as being a stand out in the West Adelaide Metro zone and in 2024 we went a step better, winning both the West Adelaide Metro zone and taking out the South Australian Auskick of the Year Award. This is tremendous recognition for the effort put in by so many people and should see many more kids, and their families, attracted to our club in 2025 and beyond. As a club should be proud of what we have achieved.
